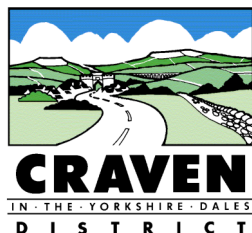


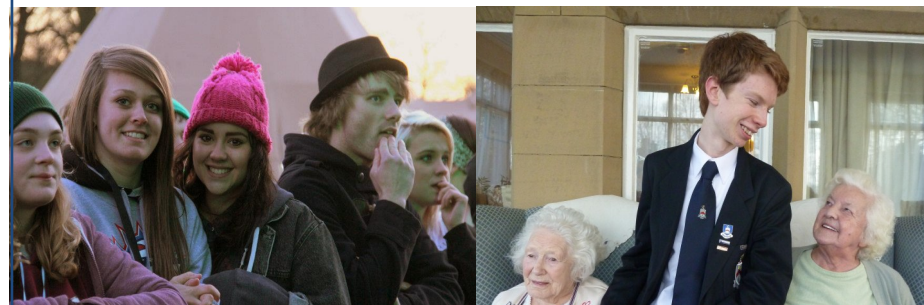

Citizen of the Year Award

This award will be given to a citizen in recognition of his or her outstanding contributions directly to Craven during the past year and will be judged on outcomes for the community.

Every Craven Community Champions 2012 award submission will automatically be entered into this award category. The winner of this special award will be chosen by the judging panel and the judges will be looking for someone who has demonstrated the following qualities:

- Has been involved in a community-based project;
- Has had a real impact in their community;
- Has shown exceptional commitment;
- Has made their project inclusive and accessible to everyone;
- Has built strong community relationships
- Has contributed to a variety of activities that increase the well-being in a community.



Young Citizen of the Year Award



Sponsored by Skipton Rotary Club

This award will be given to a young citizen aged between 13 - 19 in recognition of his or her outstanding contributions directly to Craven during the past year.

The judges will be looking for young people who satisfy as many of the criteria listed below as possible. In particular, they are looking for commitment and a positive attitude combined with a natural interest and ability to address issues which adversely affect people's lives so creating practical solutions to everyday problems.

Nominees should be able to show:

- A sustained level of achievement in contributing to a variety of activities that increase the well-being in a community;
- Demonstrate that they have worked with others in the wider community to negotiate, plan and carry out action which has made a difference to the lives of others;
- That they have taken responsibility for an aspect of a community-based project;
- That they have taken a leading role in promoting the importance of citizenship;
- The ways in which they have overcome any additional challenges they have had to face in order to realise their goal;
- Any aspects of their nomination which makes their achievement unique.

For this award only - The judges will consider all nomination forms and then select those individuals they wish to informally interview.

Award categories and criteria



Arts and Culture Award

This award celebrates those who have made an outstanding contribution to arts and cultural activities and improving participation.

The judges will be looking for a project/individual that can demonstrate the following:

- Excellence in their field;
- Commitment to their project/field of working;
- Attracting and encouraging new members;
- Working with the wider community to ensure their project is accessible to everyone;
- Has made a difference improved well-being for an individual or a community;
- Can work creatively to explore new ways of working and making the most of the resources available to them.



Carer/ Paid Care Worker of the Year Award

The Carer of the Year Award recognises the significant role that all carers undertake each day, we are looking for nominations from professional and unpaid carers that have made outstanding contributions working in either residential, respite, nursing, supported housing, day services or unpaid caring roles.

- How they have adapted to their caring role to fit in with their other commitments;
- Commitment to their role;
- How they have overcome any additional challenges in order to undertake their carer role;
- How their role as a carer makes a difference and improved the wellbeing of an individual or group
- Is a role model for others in their community



Sports Award

The judges will be looking for a project/individual that can demonstrate the following:

- Have made a difference and have improved well-being for an individual or a community;
- Can work creatively to explore new ways of working and making the most of the resources available to them.



Volunteer of the Year Award

This award recognises and rewards an individual volunteer who have made an outstanding contribution to their community.

Nominees should be able to:

- Demonstrate their commitment to a project, this does not necessarily have to be long term, it's about quality not quantity
- Demonstrate they are a role model/ ambassador for volunteering;
- Motivate and inspire others;
- Show they have made a difference and have improved well-being for an individual or a community.



Community Group of the Year Award



Sponsored by Yorkshire Housing

This award recognises and rewards a community group who have made an outstanding contribution to their community

Nominees should be able to:

- Demonstrate commitment to their project;
- Show they can attract and encourage new members;
- Demonstrate their project is inclusive and accessible to everyone;
- Show the benefits of your project for the community;
- Show the impact your project has had for the community;
- Show they have made a difference and have improved well-being for an individual or community.
- Demonstrate how they've worked creatively to explore new ways of working and making the most of what you have.
